Legislation that Passed

The WVAHP followed several bills during the 2019 Regular Session of the WV Legislature. Two in particular advance the work of managed care and the WV Medicaid Program. We look forward to working with our stakeholders and legislators in the future to strengthen healthcare in the state.

HB 2010 – Foster Care Reform
HB 2010 does several things to reform the state's foster care system. It transitions the foster care system into managed care. This move will help ensure delivery of care, elimination of redundant services, better record keeping, and provide foster families a resource to navigate the healthcare system. There are several check and balances associated with the legislation including a mandate for MCOs to conduct stakeholder meetings and make several reports to the legislature.

SB 564 - Expanding comprehensive coverage for pregnant women through Medicaid SB 564 expands medical coverage to pregnant women through Medicaid. Women who are between 185% and 300% of the federal poverty level will now receive critical medical benefits including: prenatal care, delivery, and 60 days postpartum care.
